Although Romanian migration began in the late 19th century, due to a poor standard of living that generated a movement of Romanians to the American continent, this phenomenon was not apparent in Europe up to the past decade. The most outstanding feature of the period between the two world wars was the migratory flow of Romanian intellectuals, who chose France as their favourite destination. Romanian migration acquired a marked political dimension immediately after WWII, with the Soviet occupation of Eastern Europe. After Ceausescu's dictatorship, however, the main impulse for migration was the need to

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discover the 'myth' of the western world, a world that, for so many years, had been entirely forbidden to them.

The migration of Romanians to Spain (seen as a favourite destination not only for its better standard of living and the job opportunities it offered, but also because its linguistic and cultural links with their mother country) grew rapidly after the cancellation of the Schengen visas, which made the Romanian community clearly visible throughout the country. And what this migratory flow brought with it was not just a new workforce, but also – and most importantly – a new cognitive approach which, in time, has enhanced cultural awareness and has made it possible to bridge the gap between two different societies. All this has no doubt had a far-reaching effect on the perception of 'otherness'.

This symposium aims to consider the role of translation (interpreting) within the complex network of sociocultural relations arising between the 'host' society and the Romanian minorities that have settled in a foreign country, with their own distinctive way of perceiving languages as a sign of national and ethnic identity or as an indelible feature of their individual voice. Another important aim of this symposium is to revisit the role of the translator (interpreter) in communicating ideas, knowledge and creative values and conveying the (social, ideological or cultural) *topoi* in all kinds of discourse (literary and otherwise).

As the anthropological dimension of the *zoon politikon* goes hand in hand with language and the recreation of an exotic (i.e., foreign) communicative space within a different sociocultural context is almost impossible without the use of a given language, our symposium will devote a special section to linguistics.

As far as literary discourse is concerned, we are all aware that literature can no longer be defined in itself. Studies in comparative literature have proved that it is impossible to separate the literary work from its social multidimensionality. In this respect, we believe European literature should be looked upon as a manifestation of a 'universal artistic impulse'. This should therefore be borne in mind regardless of our approach to the study of the literary text. In fact, Romanian and Spanish literature may well be regarded as two different manifestations of the same phenomenon that, at the level of philosophical aesthetics, unifies literature and music, cinema and dance, into a unique performance, one that can be sensual, Dionysiac and exuberant or rational, Apollonian and mysteriously arcane.

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For all these reasons, this symposium will provide an opportunity for scholars to exchange ideas and opinions in an academic atmosphere of tolerance, at a time in which the multiethnic, transcultural and multilingual nature of present-day Europe leaves no room for ethnocentrism.

In this event we hope to gather members of the academic community all over the world, Romanian lecturers teaching at European universities, young researchers and representatives of the so-called 'Romanian Diaspora' whose passions and professional interests fall within the following areas:

- ▣ The cultural dimension in translation and interpreting (from and/or into Romanian)
- ▣ Romanian and comparative literature
- ▣ Romanian language, languages in contact, Romance and contrastive linguistics

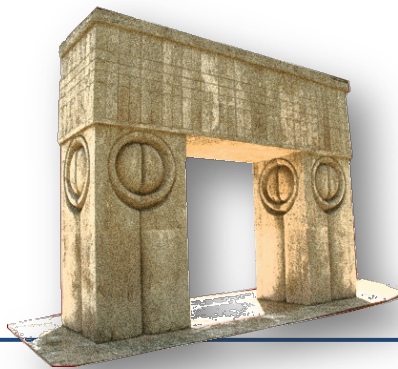

- ▣ The deadline for submission of papers is 30th January 2010.
